## Superintendent's Remarks

I am pleased to be writing the last installment of the 2010-2011 West Burlington Independent School District's newsletter. The school year is going fast and very well. Our students have made great gains in academic performance and our activity programs have experienced much success. I have found our West Burlington Schools students to be friendly, smart and helpful. Those qualities are a direct reflection of their parents. I'd like to share with you some changes that will be in place for the start of the 2011-2012 school year.

The school year will be starting on August 18th with the first semester ending on December 23rd. We are also trying a week -long spring break next year, graduation is on May 20th, and the final day of school is scheduled for May 23rd. Snow days will be made up at the end of the year. We will see how the changes work out and use your input for planning the calendar next spring.

As you are well aware we making numerous changes to our buildings. The eight-classroom Junior High school addition will be ready to start classes in August. We are upgrading our windows at the Elementary building as part of this project. We are improving our public restroom access in the cafeteria area at the Junior/Senior High school building. We will be making significant improvements to our learning environment in both buildings by installing air-conditioning in all classrooms. We will now be able to control temperatures in all classrooms, allowing for comfort for students and staff. We secured a fire safety grant which we will use to install panic hardware on exit doors to assure a quicker exit if an emergency arises.

West Burlington is also pleased to announce moving forward with heightened security measures at both buildings. The Elementary school will have an additional set of main entrance doors installed as well as a video/audio buzz-in system. Visitors to the building will gain access only by entering the front doors and going through the office. This will curtail safety concerns. We are also improving our overall security. West Burlington Schools is installing additional surveillance cameras in and outside both buildings. It is our goal to better monitor potential bullying in our hallways as well as monitoring our buildings after hours. We are also upgrading the security at the Junior/Senior High school building. Visitors will need to buzz-into our new video/audio surveillance system. These improvements will enhance our security and provide an even more safe and pleasant learning environment for all.

West Burlington Independent School District is also looking forward to changes we are implementing in our academic program. Our certified staff has spent the 2010-2011 school year aligning our standards and benchmarks with the state mandated common core curriculum. We have studied the gaps in our curriculum as well as the overlap of concepts and topics. Next school year, we will be implementing all of our curriculum changes. We know the curriculum articulation will make a significant impact upon what and how we are teaching our students. The standards and benchmarks will be available for all parents, and students, to review at any time.

West Burlington is also working on a formal professional development plan. Professional development and our curriculum work hand-in-hand in our efforts to improve instruction. Our K-12 professional development program has been streamlined in an effort to go into more depth with our certified staff training. We recognize the importance of rigor and relevance in our everyday classrooms as well as our professional development training efforts. All of our regular education classes in the Elementary school will be taught in a self-contained format. We will be offering our first dual-enrollment class next year, an advanced high school language arts course.

I am very pleased with how my first year as the West Burlington ISD Superintendent is going. The board, administrative leadership team, certified staff, noncertified staff, parents, community and most importantly...the students, have been a joy to work with. We will continue working together to improve instruction and the West Burlington Independent School District. Go Falcons!! ❖

## Math Bee

Two teams of 6th graders participated in an area wide Math Bee on Friday, April 8, 2011. The 6th graders representing West Burlington were ShayLeigh Abbott, Kamaryn Atwater, Brandon Broeg, Amber DesJardins, Jacob Graham, Dalton Machholz, and Catherine Todd.



To prepare for the Math Bee, this dedicated group met for extra practice before and after school 30 times previous to the Bee. During those practice sessions, they had the opportunity to work on standard formulas, probability, statistics, patterns and functions.

The Math Bee was held at the Fairfield Arts and Convention Center. Teams from 20 different schools were present. To start, the students worked independently on 5 rounds. The first round covered number sense & estimation; the students were given seven minutes to complete this round. The second and third rounds covered patterns & functions and geometry & measurement. For each of these rounds, the students had fourteen minutes to complete. After the third round, the students were allowed to take a fifteen minute break. The fourth and fifth round covered statistics & probability and ratio, proportion & percent. Both of these rounds were also fourteen minutes. Finally, the students were put into their teams for the team round that covered a variety of skills and abilities.

Although none of our students moved on to the state competition, they all worked very hard and put forth great effort. It was a worthwhile experience, and we are proud of our Math Bee participants. ❖

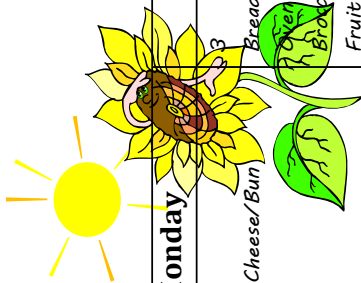


